Orienteering is an outdoor activity that combines reflection and physical commitment. This sport, which is practiced alone, or as a family activity, from children to veterans, allows you to discover different terrains in each race and to propose a new adventure to everyone's pace. Orienteering is one of the outdoor activities taught in the school environment, and is highly appreciated by the various school sports federations such as UNSS, USEP and UGSEL with which the French Orienteering Federation (FFCO) has partnership agreements.

Major Orienteering events are currently being prepared in Paris, with the Olympic Games of 2024 in mind, for which orienteering is officially nominated to become one of the 5 additional sports that will join the official program. In autumn 2019, the first edition of the Paris Orienteering City Race will take place in the center of Paris during the «Day without cars». It will be a great event for all audiences that will discover Paris in another way, with their map in hand, looking for the tags that must be found in an imposed order, while discovering hidden facets of the fantastic Parisian heritage. This event should take place every two years. But the biggest challenge is the bid for the organization of the World Orienteering Championships 2022 for what will be its second edition in urban format. So we fully rely on your support for help us in this project that will show Paris in the eyes of the world in a way never proposed before.

Orienteering in Ile de France, an ideal terrain to develop its different formats: sprint, relay, middle and long distance...

At first sight, Ile de France, and in particular Paris, could seem a territory unfit for the development of so-called outdoor activities. And yet! For a long time now, the Region has been known for orienteering, for the technical nature of its forests, especially in the Fontainebleau massif. In recent years, clubs in Paris and the suburbs of Ile de France have seized the opportunities offered to develop urban races. Thanks to the help of the Region, the Regional Olympic and Sports Committee of Ile de France and the Regional Direction of Youth, Sports and Social Cohesion, the Ile de France Orienteering League values all actions as close as possible to the public: development of accessible equipment (maps);

agreements between clubs and schools, with the Regional University Sports Federation; organization of events. For some years now, Ile de France clubs have used to organize major urban events, including the Paris O 'Tour in 2014 and the Paris City Race in 2017, which allowed riders from all over the hexagon and foreign countries, to walk down , day or night, map in hand, the prestigious places of Paris and its surroundings to find at the corner of an alley, a staircase...the tag as much sought while discovering, through the routes taken, the unsuspected faces of past or present heritage.

With the major organizations planned in the coming years, the Ile de France Orienteering League is acquiring the necessary skills to host the WOC 2022 and hopes to be able to count on the support of the Paris region and of all the French orientors to help to promote Paris and Ile de France, even beyond the orienteering activity.

Orienteering: a sporting activity for the head and the legs!

Foot orienteering is a sport recognized in France since the creation of the French Orienteering Federation in 1970.


Orienteering is practiced in leisure, in ride or in competition. A person practicing this activity is called an orienteer. It is about individual or collective races, against the clock, on familiar ground or not, with different beacons on it that the competitors has to discover in a imposed order or not : It chooses itself its route by using a map and a compass.

Orienteering seduces all the nature lovers, of reflection and of sporting activities. This discipline, which can be practiced from the youngest age and until more than 80 years, as well by competitors lovers or as simple activity of leisure or to maintain their health, is very appreciated by families in search of friendly moments that will satisfy all the members of the family. Everyone can choose what corresponds them the most: alone, with friends or in family.



In France, the French Orienteering Federation counts approximately 10 000 license holders for a competitive practice. The IOF (International Orienteering Federation) coordinates the world development of this sport which is dominated by the Scandinavian countries but which seduces also a large number of practitioners in other countries (Italy, Egypt, Great Britain...)

The traditional form of orienteering is foot orienteering no matter the ground, but others forms of orienteering were born over the years, in particular mountain bike orienteering and ski orienteering, and also different others specialties.



FOOT ORIENTEERING

Foot orienteering is the major discipline of orienteering. It is practiced as well in a natural setting (in the forest for example) as in an urban environment. Orienteering is an endurance sport that attracts both enthusiast orienteers and runners. Orientation skills are important and necessary

for route selection and memorization. It is also necessary for high performance athletes to demonstrate good adaptive skills: orienteering involves moving through different environments and adapting routes according to map directions.

ORIENTEERING IS CANDIDATE TO BECOME AN ADDITIONAL SPORT TO PARIS OLYMPIC GAMES 2024

On 6 December 2017, the French Orienteering Federation officially announced its bid to make Orienteering an Olympic sport within the Paris 2024 program. This initiative was supported by the International Orienteering Federation (IOF).

Orienteering is a sport practiced on five continents and a growing number of countries are seduced by this sport. Orienteering is practiced by people of all ages and it is particularly present in the school environment. Indeed, orienteering is an educational sport in its own right. Moreover, a convention has been signed with the UNSS (National Union of School Sport). Thus, several million students practice orienteering in the school environment and this figure is in increase: over the 2016/2017 season, orienteering has seen the number of its students increasing by an average of 24.5% compared to the 2015/2016 season.

Laurent PETRYNKA, President of the International School Sport Federation (ISF) also gave his fullest support to the FFCO in his appli-

cation process.

By 2024, the new generation orienteers will be able to take example of several French champions ranked among the best on the international level. Not surprising that France is a strong orienteering nation. Indeed, the most successful orienteer in the world level is none other than the French Thierry GUEORGIOU, with 14 titles of world champion!

Thierry GUEORGIOU is not the only French athlete to raise the French tricolour flag on the podiums of major competitions. Frédéric TRANCHAND or Lucas BASSET are also orienteers who have won several medals at the world championships!

The criteria to be fulfilled for orienteering to claim to become an Olympic sport in the Olympic Games 2024 are notably the chances of medals, the practice of orienteering at a global level or its attractiveness among young people.

Orienteering is well on its way to become a new Olympic sport and for French orienteering to win medals at home!


ABOUT ORIENTEERING

URBAN ORIENTEERING

Urban Orienteering is a part of orienteering which is developing more and more thanks to its playful aspect, accessible for the competitors and very visual for the spectators. It allows guidance counselors to evolve in a very diverse environment where monuments and buildings of all ages, parks and gardens meet.

The tourist aspect is therefore an integral part of urban orienteering. Discovering or rediscovering history while exercising sport is the essence of this discipline.

Furthermore, broadcasted competitions benefit from advanced video and production techniques. They make it possible to follow the runners in their courses, to locate them on the circuit, to compare their route choices, for a similar race time. At the same time, the images make it possible to highlight the history of the city where the competition is organized. Whether with embedded cameras, fixed cameras or even drones, the city and its cultural wealth are valued.



COMPETITIONS FORMATS

The runners have the choice between several race formats : sprint, KO sprint (knock-out sprint) and relay sprint.

The characteristics of these competitions are summarized in the table below.

FORMATS	SPRINT	SPRINT RELAY	KO SPRINT
WINNING TIME OF THE WINNER (IN ELITE)	12-15 minutes	12-15 minutes per relay	6-8 minutes per round

THE FRENCH ELITE RUNNERS

In France, foot orienteering is recognized as elite sport. The French teams participate in international benchmark competitions: world championships, world cup, European championships, world games...Each of these competitions includes various formats of orienteering races:

sprint, middle distance, long distance, relay and mixed relay.

In 2017, the performances of our sportsmen allowed to raise France in the 3rd world rank (foot orienteering and mountain bike orienteering mixed).

PARIS : A WORLD-CLASS CITY

More than 2500 athletes coming from more than 50 countries will be expected in Paris during the world championships. French orienteering has a chance to emphasize its organisation skills for the first time in a urban area. In 2017, during the European mountain bike orienteering championships in Orléans, it had been acclaimed by the present nations.

WOC 2022 will be an opportunity to show to the rest of the world the potentiel and the diversity the city of Paris is offering. The video production techniques, already used during previous championships, will allow to highlight the orienteering dynamism as well as the historic, touristic and cultural environment of the capital.

Third world's most visited city, Paris hosts more than 16 billion visitors every year. Our city inspired kings, writers, scientists, politicians, nations...It inspired traditions and trends. It inspired more than 200 movies and countless artists: painters and drawers, singers, fashion designers, renowned chefs. All had been in love with her. It is the City of Lights that keep on enchanting its inhabitants and tourists thanks to its effervescence and its timeless beauty.

It will be for everyone the opportunity to inhale the spicy aroma of the city, to eat a coffee and croissant breakfast out in the terrace of a *café*, to visit one of countless museums, to walk along its coloured side streets or down the Champs-Élysées, to go to countless tourist sites, to hang around in some of the lesser known neighbourhoods taking its iconic underground or along the Seine and of course to go to its stores, wether small or large, for some shopping. Gastronomes will have a vast choice to satisfy their

taste buds with Parisian restaurants (wether starred or not).

The rides will allow the competitors and their companions to discover very varied places which thus show that orienteering can perfectly be integrated to tourist sites.

The Champ de Mars and the Invalides, as well as the Eiffel tower as a central piece. It is an opportunity to discover the 7th arrondissement of Paris, one of the capital's upper-crust neighbourhoods.

Bercy and the National Library of France. It deals with discovering every nook and cranny of the most iconic building of Paris, inaugurated in 1995 by the President of the French Republic, François Mitterrand. On the other side of the Seine there were the former wine covered market, which can still be seen in the Cour Saint-Emilion metro station.

The Parc Floral in Vincennes. It is an opportunity to run in a botanical garden which has unique collection in the world. It was set up next to a former royal residence built by Philippe August, the Vincennes Castle, which lived numerous historical events.

The Paris business district of La Défense. It has arisen in the 60's with the construction of high rise buildings. It is also a neighbourhood where 20 000 people are living in and with malls. The construction of the Great Arch which was inaugurated in 1989 meets in the perspective of Porte Maillot, the Arc de Triomphe, Place de la Concorde and the Louvre.



The «Cité Universitaire» and its different international houses. This university residence project was made in the «golden years», after World War II. It was built in the south of Paris on top of ancient fortifications. Designed in a spirit of sharing, it encourages interactions between students coming from all around the world. At the beginning of the XXIth century there were almost 140 different nationalities within its forty residences.

In parallel with the competitions you may go to Notre-Dame Cathedral or to Sacré-Coeur, to L'Île de la Cité, to the Marais district, to Châtelet, to the Louvre museum or to the Orsay museum, through to Quartier Latin which is a symbolic place of discoveries in science and medicine.

Thousands of different things await you. In the capital, 37 bridges across the Seine river, some of which are known worldwide such as the Pont des Arts, the Pont Neuf or the Alexander III Bridge. Furthermore, the banks of the Seine, from the Sully Bridge (upstream) to the Léna Bridge (downstream), are

registered on the World Heritage List of UNESCO. It is an opportunity for a river boat ride.

From a sporting point of view, the city frequently hosts major sport events: the Tour de France finish (3rd largest sporting event from an audience's perspective) that takes place every year on the Champs Elysées, the UEFA Euro 2016, the World Judo championships, the Paris Marathon and its 50 000 competitors, the All Star Game, Roland Garros (one of the four Grand Slam tournaments), the Prix d'Amérique, the French Golf Open, the Longines Paris Eiffel Jumping, the Qatar Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe...

In 2018, the 10th edition of the Gay Games, the Ryder Cup or the women's World Handball Championships will be held in the city for instance.

The density of railways, motorways and its airport structures make Paris a convergence point for national and international transports, which allow you to come very easily.

TOURISTIC PARIS

The Eiffel Tower

The Eiffel Tower is the place not to be missed, symbol of France and more specifically of Paris through the international prism, the Eiffel Tower is undoubtedly one of the most famous monument in the world.

The iron lady, as it is affectionately referred, stands 312 meters tall (without the antennas), and weighs 10 100 tons, out of which 7 300 tons for the metal framework.

Built in 2 years, 2 months and 5 days, it was built in 1889 for the Universal Exposition.



It is the world's most visited monument with about 7 million visitors every year, of whom 75% are foreigners. The Eiffel Tower offers a unique panorama of Paris.

Also, the Eiffel Tower can be accessed and visited: on the first floor, in addition to the shops, a transparent plate was installed, that allows to see and to be visible from the forecourt. On the second floor, there is the famous Jules Verne restaurant, located 125 m above ground level, where gourmet meals are provided. Lastly, at the top, visitors can enjoy an incredible 360° view.

The Arc de Triomphe

Desired by Napoleon I and inaugurated in 1836, the Arc de Triomphe is a Roman-inspired monument. Located in the 8th arrondissement of Paris, the Arc de Triomphe is impressive in its size (50m high, 45m long and 22m wide) and in its architecture. Even though it is right in the middle of the Place Charles de Gaulle's roundabout (commonly known as Place de l'Etoile) onto which twelve lined-avenues lead to, the Arc de Triomphe is a monument open to the public. Indeed, it is possible to mourn the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier (who represents all the soldiers died for France during the history) under the shape of the arc. The building itself is accessible and its terrace leads to a unique panorama.



Lastly, one of the twelve avenues that lead to Place de l'Etoile is none other than the Avenue des Champs-Élysées, also called the most beautiful avenue in the world. With a length of 1910 meters and a width of 70 meters, it hosts 120 shops, many of which are luxury boutiques, restaurants and cinemas. Lancel, Cartier, Lacoste, Hugo Boss, Louis Vuitton, the Fouquet's Barrière, Ledoyen or the Marriott are forming part of these establishments. Every year, the merchants of the avenue generate a turnover of more than one billion euros.




The Louvre

The Louvre is one of the most emblematic museums of the capital. It is also the largest museum of art and antiquity in the world. It includes among others the painting of the Mona Lisa, made by Leonardo da Vinci at the beginning of the 16th century and famous statues like the Venus de Milo or the Victory of Samothrace.

Located between Rue de Rivoli and the Jardin des Tuileries, its exhibition area covers 72,700 m². Its main mission is to ensure the conservation, education and transmission of heritage to future generations. Every year, the Louvre is attended by nearly 10 million visitors. Originally a simple defensive fortress, the Louvre has long been one of the main residences of kings of France. It becomes museum in 1793.

From then on, it hosted Western art from the Middle Ages to 1848, as well as ancient civilizations that preceded and influenced it. About 35,000 works of art are exhibited, the oldest dating back more than seven thousand years. The museum's collections are divided into eight departments: the Department of Egyptian Antiquities, the Department of Greek, Etruscan and Roman Antiquities, the Department of Oriental Antiquities, the Department of Arts of Islam, the Department of Paintings, the Department of Sculptures, the Department of Objects of Arts and the Department of Graphic Arts. The Louvre is not composed only of the museum; the Carrousel and the Tuileries Gardens as well as the Eugène-Delacroix Museum are also attached to it.



The Sacré-Coeur

The basilica of the Sacré-Coeur of Montmartre, built in the late XIXth century, is located at the top of the Montmartre hill, not far from the district of Clignancourt in the 18th arrondissement of Paris. It's a major religious building, recognized to be of public utility in 1873.

His style is inspired by Romanesque-Byzantine style buildings such as Saint Sophia of Constantinople. Its external stones have the particular property of being very hard, to have a very fine grain and to bleach in contact with rainwater, which gives it this immaculate aspect.

The basilica is 85 meters high and 35 meters wide. Its

dome is 83 meters high.

Butte Montmartre is a place a little magical. Its panoramic view of Paris, the impressive Basilica of the Sacré-Coeur, the small cobbled streets, the place of the mound and its painters, the funicular hung on the side of a hill...make it a must in the capital.



ORGANIZERS



The International Orienteering Federation (IOF) is the international director body of orienteering. The IOF governs four orientation disciplines: foot orienteering, mountain bike orienteering, ski orienteering, and the orienteering raid. IOF was created in 1961 and is recognized by the International Olympic Committee (CIO) since 1977. It aims at promoting the various specialities of orienteering in the world and

informing the national federations and the athletes via its website and the social networks (Facebook and Twitter).

The FootO commission (foot orienteering) aims at providing information on the foot orienteering specificities and on the FootO events.
